Zoe's Home Support – Zoe's Home, Trinity Lutheran Church, Clinton, MO — \$75,000

Zoe's Home, a ministry of Trinity Lutheran Church in Clinton, Missouri, helps homeless and at-risk pregnant and parenting women in need. The Home enables women at risk of abortion or losing parental custody to overcome their current life situations and obstacles.

Residents of Zoe's Home engage in spiritual care through church activities and required Bible studies. The women participate in activities and classes to grow life skills in parenting, finances, cooking, and hygiene.

After a one-year stay in Zoe's Home, the residents' goals are to complete their education, find steady employment, procure reliable transportation, attain financial independence, find independent housing, and actively engage in church and community support services.

This grant will provide funds to meet the costs of ensuring housing, food, transportation, life skills education, case management, and staffing for Zoe's Home.

By the Voluntary Poverty of Christ, We Enter the Kingdom of God

To love and trust in earthly wealth is vanity. For nothing of this earth will last forever, nor can any of it grant eternal life (Eccl. 5:10). But the one who trusts in God is "occupied with joy in his heart" and is able to sleep in peace, "whether he eats little or much," because he knows that the "days of his life" are "the gift of God" (Eccl. 5:12, 18-20). The person who trusts in riches cannot sleep, because he "shall take nothing for his toil that he may carry away in his hand" (Eccl. 5:15). Therefore, it is difficult "for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God" (Mark 20:23). Indeed, it is impossible for man, yet "all things are possible with God" (Mark 20:27). Thus, the Rich Man, Jesus Christ, has made Himself poor and has gone through "the eye of a needle," through death and the grave, "to enter the kingdom of God" on our behalf (Mark 20:24-25). He is the "great high priest who has passed through the heavens" (Heb. 4:14), so that we may now enter His Sabbath rest by faith in His forgiveness (Heb. 4:3-9).



At the end of the month, we celebrate Reformation Day. Most know Reformation Day as the day we celebrate Martin Luther nailing the 95 theses to the church door in Wittenberg and thus sparking the Reformation. Martin Luther was many things. A father, son, monk, reformer, theologian, but also a composer and writer of hymns. His song *A Mighty Fortress is Our God* is sometimes called the battle hymn of the Reformation.

This hymn is based on Psalm 46 which contains many beautiful verses. My favorite being, Psalm 46:10, "'Be still, and know that I am God. I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth!'" That verse may not be part of the foundation of the hymn text; but I think it is a good reminder to be still. It is easy to sing many hymns and not put much thought into the beautiful lyrics. Sometimes it's nice to slow down, be still, and focus on these Biblically rich hymns we've been gifted throughout generations.

Reading John 1, we realize the Word is Christ. The devil, the world, and our sinful nature cannot defeat Christ. Christ will always remain. He is always by our side in any struggle with His gifts and the Holy Spirit, given to us in our Baptism. We can always remember that, "Since then we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need." (Hebrews 4:14-16)

In all the greatest battles, Christ is with us. Christ has already won. He's given us His ultimate victory. He continues to give us His good gifts to strengthen us in every battle that is ahead. He's also made a place for all believers in heaven. The place where no evil can ever triumph because there the Word reigns on his throne, forever.


