### John the Baptizer Points Everyone to the Messiah

The coming of God in all His unveiled power at Mount Sinai was terrifying to the people of Israel. The thundering voice of the Lord puts sinners in fear of death (Deut. 18:15-19). God, therefore, raised up a prophet like Moses—the Messiah, the Christ. God came to His people veiled in human flesh. The skies poured down the Righteous One from heaven; the earth opened her womb and brought forth Salvation (Introit) through the blessed Virgin Mary, the mother of the Lord (Luke 1:39–56). The fruit of her womb is the very Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world, the One whose sandal strap John was not worthy to loose (John 1:19-28). In Jesus we are delivered from fear and anxiety. In Him alone we have the peace of God which surpasses all understanding (Phil. 4:4-7).

#### **Sunday School**

Young Children are learning about Waiting for God's Messengers (December 1), the Birth of John the Baptist (December 8), celebrating a Christmas Party with the whole congregation (December 15), Jesus's Birth and Presentation (December 22), Boy Jesus in the Temple (December 29).

**Older Children** are doing Bible lessons with science experiments. These kids meet in the Luther Room. On December 15th, they will join the Congregation's Christmas Party.

**Youth** finished Hosea and are starting to go through the Minor Prophets. These youth meet upstairs in the youth room. On December 15th, they will join the Congregation's Christmas Party.

#### **Director of Christian Education**

My mom and I used to go to craft fairs when I was younger. I always thought it was kind of fun. There were usually pretty things to look at and if I was lucky there was kettle corn when we were done. My family amassed a beautiful collection of Christmas decorations from these craft fairs. My house had an angel room, a nativity room, a snowman room, and a santa room. We eventually had two Christmas trees. One

had the handmade ornaments, vacation ornaments, and others. The other tree was special. We bought special ornaments for it that were only white and gold. The tree went in the front room of our house.

My first year at Concordia, I loved seeing the Chrismons on the tree. It reminded me of our Christmas tree at home. I also thought it was beautiful seeing all of those ornaments pointing to Christ. Chrismons are a relatively new term and concept. Francis Kipps Spenser from Ascension Lutheran Church wanted a special way to decorate a Christmas tree in the sanctuary and to celebrate Jesus's birthday. The first Chrismon was created in 1957 and was the Chi Rho (X and P) which was Jesus's name on the tree (like you would put a name on a birthday cake).

A Chrismon is the combination of the words "Christ" and "monogram" Latin words Monograma Christi. For it to be considered a Chrismon, the design must proclaim some truth about Jesus. Eventually this expanded to include the Bible and early church. They are often white and gold to symbolize the purity and majesty of Jesus. There are hundreds examples of Chrismons. Some of the ones on our tree at Concordia include: the ichthus (fish), Bible and sword (Word of God), crown, angel, lamb, and spoon candle.

Why mention all of these Christmas ornaments, decorations, or Christmons? It is so easy to have a secular Christmas. I've watched enough Hallmark Christmas movies to know. The secular world can have decorations, music, and gift giving without pointing to Christ at all. We can easily fall into that entanglement as well. We can have a holiday where we don't acknowledge Christ as the reason we celebrate or in our celebrations. That's true in our daily vocations as well. It is so easy to fall out of the habit of going to church, attending Bible Study, reading the Bible, or even praying. It is easy to put our head down and go day to day without realizing our sin and need of a Savior.

It is easy to put our trust in the things of this world: money, jobs, doctors, ourselves, government, and other things. Choose what is hard this Advent and Christmas season (and every day). With the Holy Spirit's help, throw off the sin which so easily entangles. With God's help, take small steps like praying, reading the Bible, or attending church. Be surrounded by the great cloud of witnesses, not the things of this world. Recognize how God provides. We are Christ's witnesses in all we say, think, and do. Let's look to the author and perfecter of our faith. We need not grow weary or faint hearted. Instead, we can trust the one who has done all things for us this season and every season, Jesus.

# Tanzania Children's Homes – Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania, Africa — \$74,500

The Tanzania Children's Home welcomes albino children to offer security, care, and education. Albinism (limited melanin pigment in the skin, eyes, and hair) is especially prevalent in Tanzania. Children with albinism face health risks of skin cancer and visual impairment. Threatened by the pagan practices of tribal religions, the children receive false information that their body parts have magical powers to make them rich, successful, and powerful. The home offers security and specialized care for the children their families cannot provide. Located on the Lutheran Boarding School campus in Mwadui, the children at the Tanzania Children's Home are raised in the knowledge and love of the Lord and receive transportation to the Mwadui Lutheran Secondary School for their education.

This grant will help purchase a bus for the safe traportation of the children and will contribute to their support.



In July 2022, a group from St. John, Bingen (Decatur, IN) traveled to Tanzania to meet the pastors, deaconesses, church leaders, and children at the home they funded for their 175th anniversary.

## 2023-2025 Mission Grant #25 (Milwaukee Convention)

#### Bringing God's Word to India – India Bible Translation Project — \$100,000

Thirty-two million Christians living in India do not have access to a study Bible in their language that has abundant, doctrinally sound study notes and commentary to help in understanding God's Word. The India Bible Translation Project's mission is to publish the study notes and commentary from The Lutheran Study Bible into the Tamil and Telugu languages.

This grant will provide funds to complete the translation work. With The Lutheran Study Bible translated into their heart language, indigenous Indian pastors, seminarians, and members of Lutheran churches in India and Sri Lanka will better understand and share the Good News of Jesus Christ. The Indian Lutheran Study Bible will significantly bless the India Evangelical Lutheran Church and Ceylon Evangelical Lutheran Church members in Sri Lanka.



"The Lutheran Study Bible" translation project began at this meeting in South India in 2018. These are the translators who started working on the Tamil language translation.
