In fleeing the murderous Herod, our young Lord goes to Egypt (Matt. 2:13–23), that the prophecy might be fulfilled, "Out of Egypt I called my Son" (Hos. 11:1). Jesus brings to perfection what old Israel could not. He is the faithful Israel, the embodiment of the people of God. He offers His perfect and holy life in place of our own. He submits Himself to persecution and suffering in order to save us. Therefore, we should not think it strange when we who are in Christ experience trials because of the faith (1 Pet. 4:12–19). Rather, we rejoice to share in Christ's sufferings, knowing that we will also share in His glory.

CTSFW Food Co-op to Purchase Food for Seminary Students— \$12,000

The Food Co-op of Concordia Theological Seminary Fort Wayne provides help to 85% of student families with monthly grocery needs at no cost to them. The Food Co-op is a blessing for families operating on a student budget. Operating as an actual cooperative, each family volunteers monthly to receive points used to purchase grocery items.

Healthy Together: Healthy Workers, Healthy Church — Lutheran Family Services, U.S. — \$106,000

God directs the church to care for those He calls to serve in ministry. Church workers and their families regularly face unprecedented stress, challenges, and suffering, which affects their physical, psychological, emotional, and spiritual well-being. There is an urgent need for the church to support and care for church workers.

Lutheran Family Services is responding to this need by launching a campaign to fund expanding its services to support church workers and their families beyond lowa and into the greater Midwest. These professional services are provided on an ability-to-pay basis by the support of individuals and congregations without funding from the Synod or government to not limit their Christ-centered ministry.

This grant will help increase their ministry team of masters-level, licensed therapists who provide Christ-centered marriage and family counseling.



Launched at the Iowa District West Convention in the summer of 2022, Rev. Dr. Jim Lamb shares a personal testimony of his struggle as a young pastor and how an LFS counselor helped him by bringing professional support and the love of Jesus to him at a time when he was at a point of potential ministry burnout. Dr. Lamb reminded the group that he — and most pastors — are good at hiding their pain.
